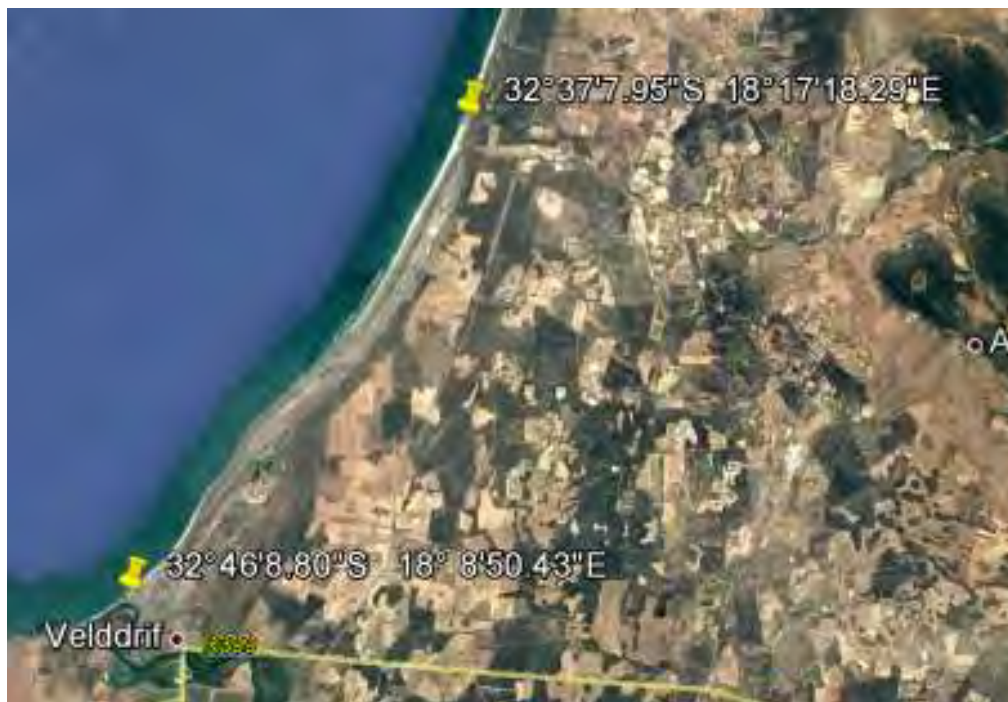

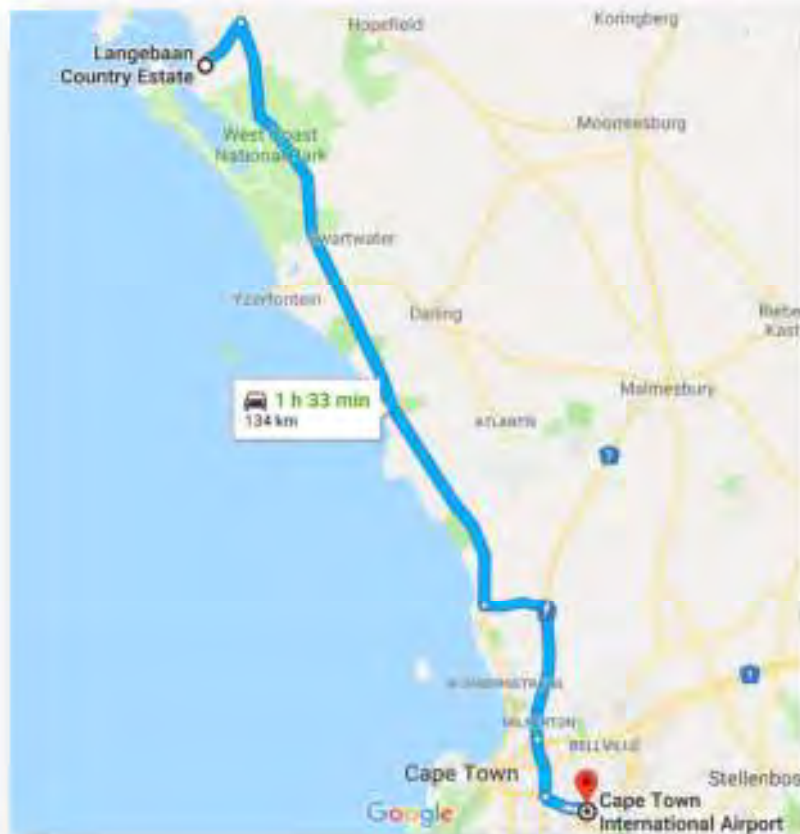

For Senior and Ladies Championships one team maximum per Nation, made up of 4 minimum and 5 maximum persons each are permitted to attend the competition.

For Master Championships a maximum of two national teams can participate.

For Pair Angling. For a team min 2 – max 3 pairs (national ranking). But for this kind of championship we allow also a participation of a single pair. So 1,2,3 pairs / nation can participate. The single pairs count only for the individual (pair) ranking.

The registration fees include organizing costs, opening and closing gala ticket, insurances, the hotel accommodation on breakfast basis, meals at the venue and diners according the program, FIPS-Mer fees as well as the according to rules.

The cost of the Opening Ceremony tickets for accompanying people is € 30,00 per person and return flights to Johannesburg are additional.

A. INSURANCE

The Organizer undertakes to have Public Liability in place.

B. MEDICAL CERTIFICATES AND MEDICAL STAFF

National organizations are responsible for supplying the Organizer with at least one (preferably two) flag of their country, of the prescribed size, as well as a CD with their national anthem in MP3 format or on a memory stick.

The winners will be awarded medals - gold silver and bronze - by FIPS-M, while the Organiser will offer cups and other commemorative awards.

TOURNAMENT ANGLING ON THE WEST COAST

Introduction

Tournament angling on the West Coast is different, VERY different! It is simply like no other area in South Africa. The water is shallow, VERY shallow, usually less than a meter deep. REALLY flat, there is simply no swell.

Because of the cold Benguela current the water is normally very cold except in the protected bays such as St Helena Bay and Saldanha Bay where the sun warms the water, as it is so shallow in the case of St Helena bay and because of the Langebaan lagoon in the case of the Saldanha Bay area. The result is that all the angling is done in these two bays. In both these bays the water can be as warm as 24° C and so most of the fish are concentrated there.

Bergriver Mouth to Dwarskersbos and Varkenvlei

The road to Dwarskersbos runs parallel to the coast, making it very accessible by any vehicle. The first entry point is at the beacon. From this point it is possible to follow the coast all the way to the swartbossie, a distance of two to three kilometers. Because of the track being a 4x4 track it is fished less often than the rest of the area, but often produces good fish, especially bull rays. The most popular area fished is from the swartbossie to the Lapa. This area is heavily fished by local anglers, fishing for cob and galjoen, [every year a few giant cob are caught by anglers fishing for galjoen with white mussel] for the competitive angler this can be the most productive area and has been known to produce great numbers of fish.

The Lapa the fish are generally taken on a long cast and because of this it usually fishes better on a low tide. Again this area has quite a lot of reef and it is important to know where they are as again the fish seem to swim along these rocky areas.

From the Lapa to Dwarskersbos there are numerous reefs, which open on the low tide. This whole area [+/- 3kms] is a good area for all the flat fish, especially blue rays.

The water along this area is normally brown and flat and because of this the predominant bait is sardine and mullet

Langebaan

This is the area that produces the most Smooth hound fish. It also produces Lesser Guitar fish [most of the Lesser Guitar fish are the round nose specie which grow slightly larger than the standard Lesser Guitar Fish], Bull Rays and the odd Kob is also caught.

In Langebaan first important spot is the Spit in Langebaan, which is a prime spot for catching smooth hounds. It fishes best from two hours before low tide till two hours after low tide, as this is when the current is slack.

Because of the fish being targeted, squid is very important bait in this area. The smooth hounds here seem to prefer squid above any other bait. Mullet are the second most important bait, especially a slightly larger mullet so that a reasonable bait can be made of the head. Sardine is important for Lesser Guitar Fish bait. The bait allocation for this area will be Squid, mullet and sardine.

APPROPRIATE TACKLE

Because of the size of the fish being targeted an angler will need two sets of rods and reels. When fishing for Smooth hounds an appropriate rod would be 4m and a 6 to 8 ounce tip. When fishing for the smaller flat fish a 3.5m and a 4 to 6 ounce tip would be better. The problem of two rods can be overcome by having one rod with two different tips.

The reels that are mostly used are the Shimano or Daiwa 20 or 30. It would be appropriate to have a reel filled with a good quality nylon with a diameter of 0.50mm and one with 0.45 mm. for shock leaders a range from 0.65 to 1.00mm would be suggested.

For terminal tackle sinkers should range from simple teardrop sinkers 75gr to 175gr. When there is current in the Langebaan area the breakaway with wires in them will be needed. Here only heavy sinkers would be needed 150 to 175grs. The hook range would be from 3/0 to 6/0 for the lighter fishing, while 7° to 10° will be needed for the heavier fishing.

It would not be advisable to use more than two hooks at any one time as the fish are of such a size that they may break each other off even when fishing with two hooks this happens.

CONSERVATION

South African angling is VERY conservation conscious and will insist that all fish be returned to the water as soon as possible with as little trauma as possible. We also allow no gaffing of fish as all the fish here can easily be landed without being gaffed. The use of circle hooks **minimum 2'0 is compulsory** but if a hook is swallowed by a fish the trace must immediately be cut. We also insist that no rays be turned on their backs when removing hooks as this can cause them permanent damage.

WARNING

Some of our fish have spikes and can cause ugly wounds. The most dangerous are the barbel as their spikes have venom which can cause extreme pain. The blue rays and the duckbill rays have a spike on their tail which can also cause ugly wounds. The St Josephs have a spike on their backs which should be handled with caution.

In Conclusion the West Coast looks forward to welcoming all competitive anglers to our waters, may you all enjoy your stay and come back again as this is probably the last frontier of angling in South Africa.

BAITS

THE BELLY OF A SARDINE

1. The belly part is cut out with a sharp knife.
2. Make a slit on both sides of the backbone and remove it. The bait is now hooked, leaving the point of the hook protruding from the skin side. Finally the bait is neatly washed with clean water.



Keep in the water to attract fish quickly. Unfortunately, the white belly ("white") is very likely to draw the attention of predators.

Remark: This is a very effective bait, as the strong flavour in the stomach is set.

SARDINE FILLETS

After having removed the head and tail of the sardine, cut out the two fillets on both sides of the backbone. Cut through the back of each fillet in the length, stopping before cutting through the skin. Hook the first fillet at its broad side so that the hook protrudes from the back side, fold the tail along the length side around the hook shank and secure it. The second fillet is now pinned on the first one and secured. Separate the head portion of the sardine over the bait for extra flavour and you will end up with a most tempting bait for amongst others lob, snail and even white steenbras.



FILLETED SARDINE

The photo shows a sardine that has been filleted from the top of the back, like a steak. The hook, with lines either around the snout, is inserted at the skin side. The filleted sardine is now wrapped around the hook shank as shown and secured.



1. Cut a strip of chokka as indicated.
2. Thoroughly soften the part above the broken line.
3. Insert the hook at the dot and secure the softened part to the hook shank. The completed slim bait can be seen at the bottom of the page.



Remark: With this bait as a basic, you can also try the following variations, which may pleasantly surprise you:

- Add one or two sandprawns to the basic bait.
- Slide a piece of bloodworm, which has been turned inside out, down your hook trace. Pull it over the basic bait (like a sleeve) and secure with thin cotton thread. This juicy bloodworm, with the two chokka "legs" hanging free, is one of the most tempting baits to offer a white steenbras.
